Dear Parents,

The accompanying information provides updates on staffing and programs for 2019. I hope you find the details helpful and informative. Children enjoyed spending the afternoon with their 2019 classmates and teachers today.

THE HUB IN 2019

This work will continue in 2019 with Mrs Dimity Hemingway (Tues – Friday) , Mr Aidan McLindon (Mon and Thurs) Marg Warren and Aley Allen (nominated programs) all contributing their expertise.

GARDEN PROGRAM

The Garden Program will continue next year under the guidance of Liz Hubbard. Liz is part of the School Food Gardens Team which operates under the Cultivating Communities Organisation. Liz will come each Monday and work with our Year 1, 2 and 3 students to continue our Garden Program.

SPECIALIST PROGRAMS

The following specialist subjects will be offered: Performing Arts, Visual Arts, Physical Education, Sports, Garden, Science/Sustainability. Indonesian instruction will continue with all teachers and students involved in a whole school approach to language where everyone learns together.

Extension and Intervention Programs in Literacy and Numeracy will continue to be developed and delivered according to student need.

SENIOR SCHOOL ELECTIVES PROGRAM

The senior school electives program will continue in 2019 offering students wonderful opportunities to select areas such as Outdoor Education, Coding, Robotics, Science, Music, Movie Making, Visual Arts and more.

MOVING DAY

In 2019 the year 1,2, 3 and 4 classes will be located in different classrooms. We have set aside next Monday 17th December as 'moving day'. This will involve moving classroom furniture and supplies to the 2019 classrooms.

Due to the move, there will not be regular classes for students in years 1,2,3 and 4 on Monday 17th December, and while we will run alternative programs for these students, they may not be with their usual teacher or in their normal classroom. Teachers will talk about this with students at school to prepare them for the disruption to normal programs.

School Resumes for 2019 on Thu 31st January

Wednesdays from 6th Feb – 7th March inclusive are rest days for Prep Students.

Note: Each Prep student will attend a one hour assessment appointment on one of these Wednesdays - date to be advised.

PAYING FEES

Accounts are issued at the start of the school year. Fee payments are due by the end of week 3 each term unless a payment plan is in place. School fees and levies can be paid by EFTPOS, Visa or Master card, Direct Debit, Online Transfer or Cash. You can also make payment by telephoning the office with your credit card details.

Those wishing to set up a Direct Debit authority are asked to contact the office and complete the form authorising regular payments on fortnightly or monthly basis. These can be automatically deducted from your bank or Centrelink payment. If making payment directly into the school account – be sure to note family name.

Conveyance Allowance.

This allowance supports families who have to travel more than 4.8km to attend the school – provided they are not residing closer to another Catholic school. This allowance varies according to distance travelled and students in the car – approx. range: \$400 - \$550 plus \$200 per additional child

Any families experiencing financial hardship in regard to their fees are strongly encouraged to seek an appointment with the principal or bursar to set up appropriate arrangements. No family should consider leaving our Catholic School due to financial difficulties.

FEE SUPPORT

CSEF – Camp Swimming and Excursion Fund

Families holding a valid means-tested concession card such as health care card and pension card are eligible to apply for the CSEF allowance. Families in receipt of this allowance are also eligible for a rebate on fees. In addition \$125 per year is paid for eligible primary school students direct to school to contribute towards the cost associated with camps, swimming and excursions. You will be notified via the newsletter in Term 1 when applications are available.

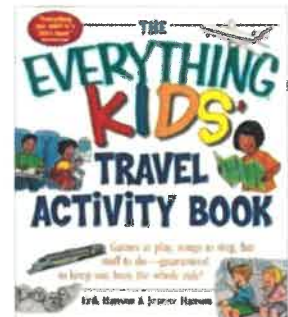
